The Basker Manta Gummy project in Victorian waters has been a successful novel offshore oil project. This evening some of the challenges and solutions of the project will be discussed. Notably the technology includes the use of the first Floating Production Storage Offtake (FPSO) development in south-east Australia enabling commercial development of a previously marginal oil field; the use of the first dedicated shuttle tanker in Australia and the innovation required in the totally subsea development which results in minimum footprint offshore and no onshore footprint.

The team will provide a high level summary of Basker Manta Gummy achievements to date and plans for future development before describing the subsea facilities that are installed at present and discussing some of the installation challenges.
